**SOCIALISM IN NORWAY**  
Norwegian socialists maintain that the socialist economy they have foisted on their country has caused no loss of individual political freedoms and civil liberties. Either their vision is faulty or they are careless with the truth as the following items which appeared in "Farm-land," published at Oslo, Norway, would seem to indicate.

"A Norwegian workman living with his wife and three children in overcrowded quarters decided to build an addition to his one-room house. He felled the timber on his own land, had it sawed and built the addition entirely himself.

"But the State's Price and Rationing Inspectorate came along on a round of inspection before the man had obtained a building permit. He was reported to the police and ordered to pay Kr. 1000 in fines and costs. When he refused to do so, he was taken to court.

"The prosecuting counsel, in summing up for the state, made the following pronouncement: 'The law says that it is not the individuals place to consider his own housing situation and decide that he ought to build. The State has taken over the individual's authority to make decisions for himself.'

"The lesson to be learned here is that we must protect 'The American Way' against the socialists, American style, who are trying to destroy it.
