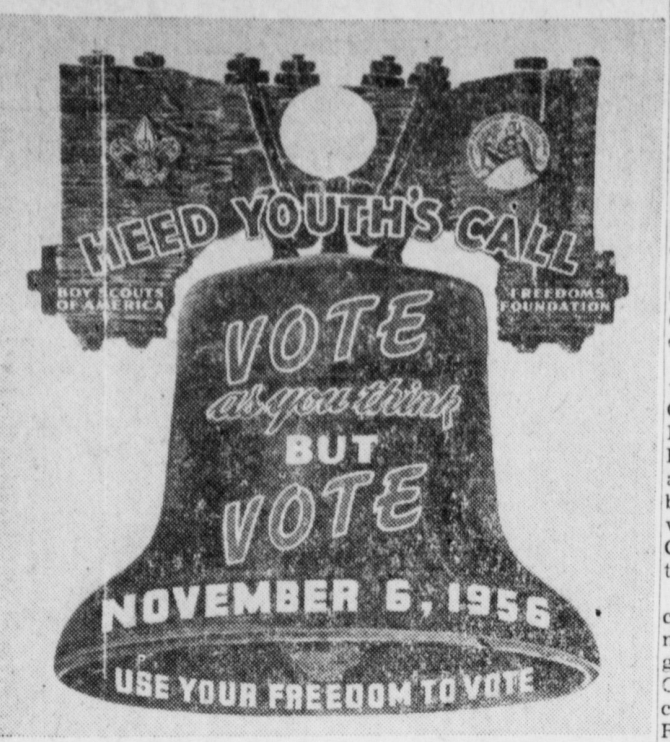


Boy Scouts to Visit 35 Million Homes

ARMY SPECIALIST REPORTED TO DATE

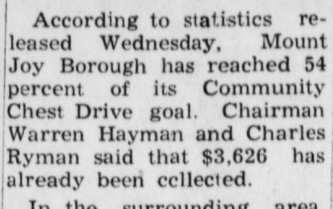
