In the freezing weather all three companies banded together and worked as one with no grumbling no arguments, complaints, and as a unit did the impossible in holding the fire to the front portion of our building and seving thousands of dollars damage, in addition to making it possible to continue in business without

any interruptions whatsoever. We observed these volunteer workers from all walks of life and differing occupations working here with no regard to race, creed or color to help others When we consider these men were doing their work without any thought of pay or rewards, we knew




