## Landisville - Salunga

Landisville - Salunga—The Jayceeettes, a ladies auxiliary organization to the Junior Chamber of Commerce has been organized in the Landisville-Salunga area. 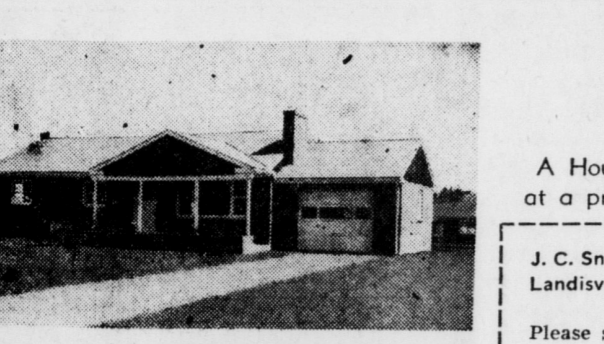
