

Women To See Movie On Cancer Examination

The women in Lancaster will have an opportunity shortly to learn how to safeguard their health and lives. They will have a chance to see a motion picture that doctors say already has saved the lives of a great many women and can be the means of saving thousands more each year.

Showings of that film, entitled "Breast Self-Examination," have been arranged by the Lancaster Unit of the American Cancer Society, for Tuesday, Dec. 4th at 7:30 a. m. at the Capitol Theatre, Dr. Paul O. Inoke, its president has announced.

For five years this picture, teaching women to examine themselves for early signs of possible breast cancer, has been a vital factor in the ACS nationwide public education program. It was produced jointly by the Cancer Society and the National Cancer Institute of the U. S. Public Health Service.

"With good taste and dignity the film portrays a technique of self-examination, which enables the viewers to find possible lumps in their breasts that might spell cancer. It makes clear, however, that the majority of lumps discovered will not be malignant. Emphasis is placed on the fact that when cancer of the breast is detected in its early stages and proper treatment is begun at once, 70 per cent of all cases can be cured. The present cure rate for this type of cancer is only 35 per cent."

"This year the number of American women who will die from breast cancer will be about 21,000. The number of lives thus lost which could have been saved through earlier detection will run to about 11,300."

There is no admission charge, and there will be no solicitation of funds.

Major General Henry Kimmel Fluck, distinguished military figure and Commanding General of the 28th Infantry Division, Pennsylvania National Guard, has been appointed 1957 State Campaign Chairman of the Pennsylvania Division, American Cancer Society. General Fluck will lead the Cancer Crusade for funds during "Cancer Control Month" next April.

General Fluck first became associated with the American Cancer Society during the 1956 Cancer Crusade. On behalf of the Dauphin County Unit, he was in charge of solicitation of 23,000 state employees in Harrisburg. He participated in the Campaign on a state-wide basis, signing a general directive to all units of the 28th Division, instructing them to help ACS County Units in the educational phase of the Cancer Crusade.

Plans are now being made for General Fluck to meet with County Crusade Chairmen at campaign meetings to be held in Johnstown, Dec. 8 and 9, and in Hershey, Dec. 15 - 16.
