Big Power Plant Back In Action

Pennsylvania Power and Light Company's "minute man" Wallenpaupack power plant sprang back into action recently when water again roared through the turbines, setting the two huge hydroelectric turbine generators in motion. The plant's return to duty marked completion of a five-months-long replacement project during this time the lower half of the 14-foot-in-diameter, 30-year-old wood stave flow line from Lake Wallenpaupack to the plant was replaced by a new, galvanized steel tube. The remaining half of the original wood line is presently undergoing tests to determine when its replacement should be made.

The project began early in June after tests indicated that repairs on the lower half of the line were no longer practical and that the only course of action was replacement.

The initial steps in the project were taking the hydroelectric plant out of service, draining the water from the flow line, severing the wood stave line at the half-way point, installing a steel bulkhead there and refilling the remaining half. The latter two steps were critical ones with time an important factor. A bulkhead of ample strength to withstand the great pressure exerted by the water had to be installed in the shortest possible time to prevent excessive shrinking of the wooden staves. Steel tie rods at either side of the line and anchored to 600-ton log cribs filled with gravel held the bulkhead rigidly in place against a force of a half-million pounds.

The Company took full steps to inform local residents, regular summer visitors and others of the flow line project and its purpose. Happily, for all interested the weather as far as the lake level was concerned, behaved beautifully. It rose more than normal in early summer and practical stabilization itself by midsummer making the utility's big lake again ideal as a vacation spot.

The operation of the past few days, returning the power plant to duty, was largely a reversal of the procedure carried out in June. Water was drained from the wood portion of the 14-foot-in-diameter tube. The bulkhead was removed and what had been the bulkhead collar became the junction between the remaining woodstave section and the new steel tube.

During the installation of the steel tube, major overhaul of the generating plant equipment was accomplished and the big valves that regulate the flow of water to the turbines were replaced.
