

Landisville - Salunga

Thirty members of the Landisville Lions club attended a meeting of the community service club last Monday night at the Landisville Fire Hall.

Speaker of the evening was Mr. Lester W. Bailey, of Lancaster, who gave a talk on the geography of the American and Canadian Rockies. Mr. Bailey, who has toured every state in the union and also sixteen foreign countries, illustrated his lecture with colored stereo slides.
