PROPOSED RULES AND REGULATIONS OF MT. JOY BOROUGH AUTHORITY

Lancaster County, Pa. Adopted for the use of the Sewer System of said Authority pursuant to Resolution adopted by said Authority on the 11th day of December, 1956.

The following Rules and Regulations for the use of the Sewer System of Mt. Joy Borough Authority, as provided for in a Resolution adopted by the Board of said Authority on the 22nd day of May, 1956, entitled, in part, "A Resolution of Mt. Joy Borough Authority, Imposing Sewer Connection Charges and Sewer Rentals and Charges For the Use of the Sewers and Sewer System of the Authority in the Borough of Mount Joy and Certain Adjoining Areas upon the Owner of Property Served by Such Sewers," and Providing for Rules and Regulation," and also as provided for by Ordinance enacted by the Council of the Borough of Mount Joy on May 23, 1956, entitled, in part, "Requiring That All Occupied Buildings in the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pa., Be Connected with the Sanitary Sewer System; ... Providing for Rules and Regulations," be and the same hereby are adopted:

Section 1. Definitions
The definitions set forth in the said Resolution of the Authority adopted on May 22, 1956, and in the said Ordinance of Borough Council enacted May 23, 1956, are hereby incorporated in these Rules and Regulations as read and as though said definitions were herein set forth in full.

In addition, the following terms as used in these Rules and Regulations shall have the following meanings unless the context requires different meaning:
The term "service line" is applied to that part of the main drain or sewer extending from a point five feet outside of the outer wall of a building or vault to its connection with the lateral.

The term "house drain" is applied to that part of the main horizontal drain and its branches inside the walls of the building or vault and extending to and connecting with the service line.

The term "soil pipe" is applied to any vertical line of pipe or more water closets, with or without other fixtures.

The term "vent-pipe" is applied to any pipe extending through the roof provided to ventilate the system of piping and to prevent trap siphonage and back pressure.

The term "plumbing fixtures" are receptacles intended to receive and discharge any liquid water or water carried wastes into a drainage system or treatment works with which they are connected.

Section 2. Application for Service Line
Any person owning an occupied building upon premises butting on the Sewer System desiring the introduction of a service line from the curb line to the building must first make written application in the form furnished by the Authority. The application must be signed by such person or his duly authorized representative.

No person owning any premises connected with the Sewer System, or tenant of such premises shall permit another person or premises to use or connect with his service line, except upon written permit from the Authority.

Section 3. Permit for Connection
Before making any connection to the Sewer System, a permit must be obtained from the Authority. A permit authorizing such connection may be granted after proper application therefor, has been made to the Authority and upon payment of the connection charge. Upon completion of each connection the permit shall be returned to the Authority and endorsed showing its approval of the connection and service line, and the permit then returned to the person to whom the permit was issued.

Section 4. Service Connections
Service Connections from the curb line to the building shall be laid at the expense of the property owner, but shall be subject at all times to the inspection and approval of the Authority or its duly authorized representative who shall have supervision and control over the same. The service line shall be constructed of terra cotta pipe or medium heavy cast iron and of a size not less than six inches in diameter. The slope of the service line shall be not less than one-quarter inch per foot when possible.

Terra cotta pipe shall be laid on a carefully prepared subgrade with holes excavated to receive the bells. Joint shall be watertight, using either cement mortar or "G. K. Water Tight Compound" or its approved equivalent. When iron pipe is used joints must be rendered watertight by filling with oakum and

lead, a leadite or equivalent, hand caulked to make them gas-tight.

The connection to the service line from the building, for a distance of five feet from the building toward the curb line must be made of medium heavy cast iron pipe.

Section 5. Duty of Owners and Occupants
It shall be the duty of every person constructing or owning any house drain, soil pipe, vent pipe, plumbing fixtures or any other passage or connection between a sewer and any ground, building, erection or place of business, and in like manner the duty of the owners of all grounds, buildings, erections, and all parties interested therein, to cause and require that such house drain, soil pipe, waste pipe, vent pipe, plumbing fixtures or any other passage or connection shall be adequate for its purpose, and shall at all times allow to pass freely all material that enters or should enter the same and no change of the sewer connection of any property shall be permitted unless notice thereof shall have been given the Authority, and assent thereto obtained in writing.

Section 6. Location of Main Trap
The house or building must be provided with a horizontal sewer trap, located inside the cellar wall or as close thereto as practical, allowing for construction circumstances. The trap must be provided with a handle for convenience in cleaning the cover of which must be properly fitted and made gas and air-tight, with heavy brass screw-cap ferrule, caulked in and provided with a fresh-air inlet on the house side of the drain. This class of trap shall be subject to the approval of the Authority.

Section 7. Fresh-Air Inlet
For new construction a fresh-air inlet must be connected with the drain just inside the intercepting trap. Where underground, it must be of medium heavy cast iron. It may finish with an open end in the face of the wall or it may connect to an open vent near the building. The fresh-air inlet must be of same size as the drain, up to four inches. For five and six inch drains it must not be less than four inches in diameter, and for larger drains, not less than eight inches in diameter, or its equivalent.

Section 8. Ventilation of Pipes and Soil Lines
For new construction traps shall be protected from siphonage or air pressure by special vent pipes. Traps should not be more than approximately 24 inches from the vertical lines serving the trap, and of a size conforming to good practice.

Section 9. Grease Traps
All hotels, restaurants, boarding houses and public eating places before draining into said sewerage system shall install grease traps on all house drains except toilet line and floor drains. The grease traps shall be Jasco or equivalent approved make and of a size approved by the Authority.

Section 10. Other Traps
Suitable, approved traps shall be installed by garages, washing, cleaning or repairing establishments to insure that no inflammable or explosive mixture enters the public sewers. No manufacturer, dry cleaner, dyer, brewer, distiller, slaughter house, dairy, soap factory, packing house or other manufacturing establishment shall cause or permit any substance to flow into the sewers which may form a stoppage or injure in any way the sewers or disposal works. All establishments discharging matter into the sewers shall be held responsible for any stoppage or injury if disposal works or injure the same, or to cause a nuisance shall not connect to any sewer except through one or more intervening catch basins, or through a screen, as may be prescribed by the Authority and if the matter discharged by any establishment cannot, in the determination of the Authority, be rendered harmless to the sewer or to the public health, they shall be excluded from the sewer entirely.

Section 11. Sewer Discharge
No roof, storm, surface or ground waters, oils, tar, grease, gasoline, combustible gases or liquids, garbage (except garbage run through a garbage grinder) or insoluble solids or any substance which would impair or interfere with the Sewer System, or any part thereof in any manner, or with the function of the processes of sewage treatment, shall be discharged into the Sewer System.

No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged into the Sewer System any ash, cinders, sand, mud, straw, hay, shavings, metal gas craps, rags, feathers, plastics wood, or any other or viscous substance capable of causing obstruction to the flow in the Sewer System or other interference with the proper operation of the Sewer System or the processes of sewage treatment.

Section 12. Inspections
The Authority or its representatives shall have the right of access at all reasonable times to all parts of any premises connected with the Sewer System and to examine thereto and the plumbing fixtures for any improper connection, installation, maintenance or use. The Authority may make reasonable charges for such inspections to users of the Sewer System.

Section 13. Release of Liability
In consideration of the right to connect to the Sewer System, the Authority shall not be liable for any damage or expense resulting from leaks, stoppages or defective plumbing or from any other cause, occurring to any premises or within any house or building; and it is hereby expressly stipulated by all persons making connection with the Sewer System that no claims shall be made against the Authority on account of the breaking or stoppage of, or any damage to, any service line or connection when the cause thereof is found to be in such house lateral or connection.

The Authority shall not be liable for a deficiency or failure when occasioned by an emergency, or repairs or failure for any cause beyond its control.

Section 14. Changing Rules and Regulations
The Authority reserves the right to, and may, from time to time, revise, amend and readopt such rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper for the use and operation of the Sewer System, and all such Rules and Regulations shall be and become a part of this resolution.

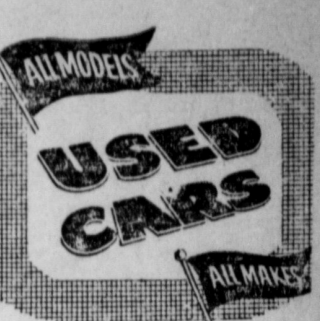
