Tuesday night of this week the Indians of Coach Ken Depoe absorbed another defeat, bowing at Pequea Valley, 59-52.

After a slow start, which saw them trailing, 20-7 at the quarter, the Green and White stiffened and at the end of the half were behind only 32 to 21 and at the three-quarters were lagging only 45-42.

In the preliminary, Pequea won, 29-25.
