not reside in the same district as the college. Worth \$1200. The foundation scholarships are worth \$300.00 for each year or a total value of \$1,200.00 for the four years of college. There are now 104

students in college who receive this financial aid. Of this total, 67 attend Millersville, 26 attend Shippensburg, 6 attend West Chester and 5 attend Kutztown. Because of the expanded business, the number of scholarships was increased and the list of colleges was expanded. The scholarships are available only to students who reside in the counties in which the SICO Company conducts business and to students who will prepare for teaching in the elementary public schools. The last named restriction was established because of the long existing scarcity of teachers for the elementary schools.
