Attends Session In Washington

John Hart, high school principal of Donegal high school, said that one of the most impressive programs of the National Association of Secondary School Principals convention was one in which thirty-three foreign students appeared before the group. Mr. Hart attended the convention recently in Washington, D. C.

Some of the ideas brought to attention by the group's observance of the American students were their lack of respect for teachers; their lack of appreciation for things that they do have. One student from the Union of South Africa said American schools might be more democratic if students were to wear uniforms. Others felt that the American students do not take enough courses. Koo Lee of Korea said Americans have good reason to fear communism.
