Snyder farm, will be graded and leveled.

On the northwest corner of this land, fronting on the road leading from the Little Chickies creek to the Mount Joy cemetery, will be erected a fine, concrete block club house, 30-60 ft. On the entire east side of the building will be erected a spacious porch from which point spectators will be able to witness any or all activities in progress on the entire club grounds. Along the Snyder road there will be ample car parking for members and guests. The building will have a spacious recreation room, office, lockers, and toilet facilities.

As a safety measure and in order to comply with all state regulations and requirements pertaining to the safety of participants, guests and those residing in the surrounding community, they will erect a soil bank along the side of the plot toward the Snyder farm. This bank will be 196 feet long, 45 feet wide at the base, 10 feet wide at the top and 25 feet high. This will be the backstop for all rifle and revolver shooting on one of the most modern ranges to be seen anywhere.

Adjacent to this range, toward the creek, will be an archery range where enthusiasts of all ages can participate in their favorite pastime.

In addition, the management will make ample provision for clay target shooting, installing equipment for trap and skeet shooting immediately and at the same consider expansion for this popular sport.

While the sportsmen will cater to hunters, the management will by no means overlook the fishermen or women. The water from a spring near the club house will be piped to the former ice ponds. These ponds will be greatly improved and stocked with game fish, particularly trout.

With the improvements, together with the advantages of location near town, plus Cove and the Boro Parks, the Sportsmen will have provided facilities for amusement and entertainment of its growing membership, now numbering 442 members and their wives and children and the general public.

Those who are in accord with the efforts of the Sportsmen's Association may join for \$1 per year dues and have a voice in the contemplated activities. All may buy a Block or, better still, do both, thereby making possible great pleasure and amusement for all.

Students To See Traffic Tests

Students at Donegal high school will have front row seats Monday morning April 8, when some of their classmates learn the facts of life-on-the-highways.

Wilbur I. Beahm, supervising principal, said the event will be in the nature of a test-demonstration, designed to disprove the old notion that a car can be "stopped on a dime."

Two students, a faculty member and a policeman will take turns at the wheel of a specially equipped car and they'll bring it to an emergency stop while traveling at 20, 30 or 40 miles an hour.

The demonstration will be preceded by a student assembly during which students will be briefed on the demonstration and hear an illustrated talk on the importance of driver attitudes.

Mr. Beahm said the assembly will begin at 9 a.m. and the test will follow about 45 minutes later on the parking lot, in the rear of the school. The demonstration is being sponsored by John E. Tynall, local representative of Nationwide Insurance Companies.

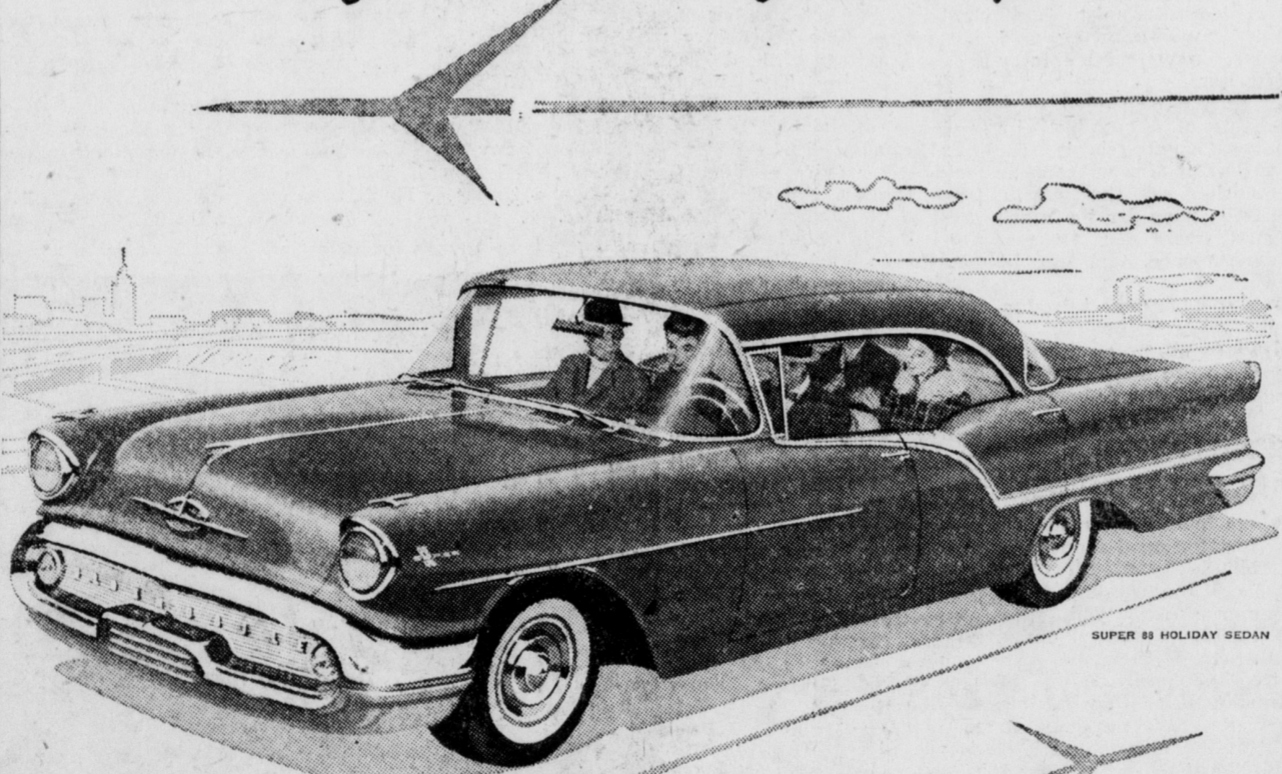
