### Set Date For Registration First Grade

Registration for children who did not attend kindergarten in the Donegal Area but who plan to enter first grade in the fall will be held on Wednesday, May 15, in the five kindergartens of the area. These children will be registered during the morning of May 15.

First grade children must be six years of age on or before January 31, 1958 in order to enter school in September, 1957. They must take and successfully pass the pre-school tests. Parents must bring the child's birth and vaccination certificates the day for registration and testing.

Children who are attending kindergarten need not register. The regular kindergarten sessions will not be held that morning in Mount Joy Township (Florin North School), Florin, Maytown and Marietta.
