Spring Cleaning

It's Spring cleaning - and fix-up time - for motorists too. Proper and thorough preparation now for warmer-weather driving will pay handsome dividends in comfort, safety and economy in the months to come, advises Keystone Automobile Club.

"Winter always 'takes something out' of automobiles, both old and new, so it's the wiser motorist, indeed who takes time out right now to get things shipshape again," says Samuel T. Milliken, Service Manager of Keystone.

The KAC official listed the following "things to do":

1. Drain anti-freeze solution from radiator, flush and refill. Check hoses for breaks or weak spots. Check radiator for damage to cores.

2. Check air pressure in tires and keep up to manufacturer's specifications. Tires on all four wheels should be switched to insure more even wear.

3. Have brakes and brake fluid checked.

4. Make certain all lights and turning signals are functioning perfectly.

5. Tune motor for better gas mileage.

6. Change motor oil to proper viscosity. Check filter for possible replacement.

7. Check windshield wiper action and cleaning efficiency of blades.

8. Check exhaust for possible leaks to eliminate carbon monoxide dangers.

9. Lubricate chassis and have body bolts tightened if necessary.

10. Replace cracked or broken glass.

11. Clean up and repaint rust spots.

12. Clean out glove compartment; make certain sun glasses are handy.

US Redefines 'Small' Firms

Some Under 500 Big, Some Over 500 Small

Wendel B. Barnes, Administrator of the Small Business Administration, has announced adoption of a revised definition of small business for government procurement purposes, which permits some firms with fewer than 500 employees to be classified as large, while others with more than 500 employees may be classified as small.

The revised definition introduces a new element of flexibility into government purchasing, and modifies the old arbitrary and inflexible rule that for government procurement purposes all firms with 500 or more employees are large and those with less than 500 employees are small.

Effective Jan. 1 The new definition became effective for all government purchasing agencies on January 1, 1957.

Mr. Barnes said: "The new definition of small business, as it applies to government procurement, has the full approval of the 14 government agencies concerned with purchasing problems. It permits a greater measure of equity and recognizes the factor of dominance in an industry, regardless of the number of employees."

"Under the new ruling, a business enterprise with fewer than 500 employees cannot be considered small if it is dominant in its field of operation. On the other hand, a relatively small business enterprise which is primarily characterized by a large number of employees may be certified as small business even though it has more than 500 employees."
