(merged June 1, 1955). Revenues for the twelve months ended March 31, 1957, after appropriate adjustment to reflect such Commission orders, were \$129,272,649, an increase of 4.8% over comparable revenues for the previous year.

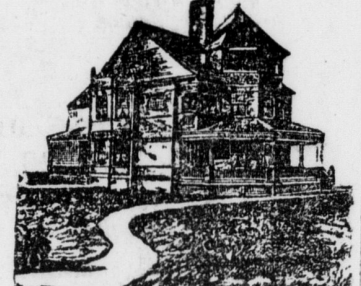
