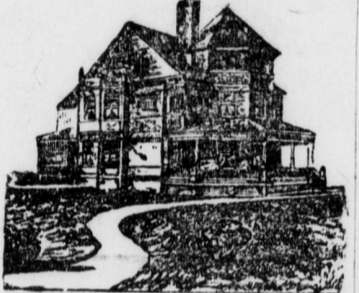

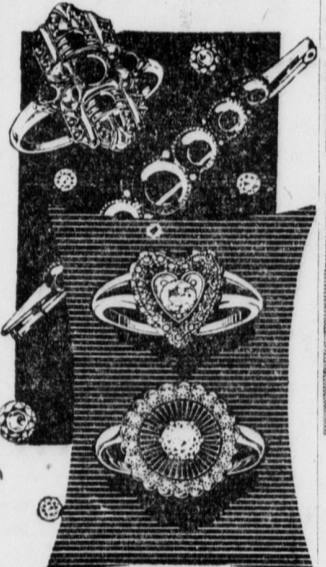

men, welfare workers, educators, clergy, labor officials and other interested citizens. The local scholarship opportunities were extended to all city and county schools.

The first annual "College Night" program will be presented by the Guidance Department of the Hempheld High School, Landisville, on Friday, May 10, beginning at 8:00 p.m., in the school auditorium.

Headlining the program will be a panel composed of representatives from Millersville, Elizabethtown and Franklin and Marshall Colleges and the Pennsylvania State University. The panel will discuss such pertinent questions as who should go to college, is college necessary today, the cost of college, what the college expects of its students, how the student prepares himself to meet the current demanding college requirements, and what does the future hold.

Following the panel, meetings will be held in separate classrooms where parents and students may ask specific questions of the college representatives. Parents of prospective college students now in any grade in high school are urged to attend as well as any other interested persons.

College representatives are Dr. Wm. H. Duncan MSTC; Ely C. Espenshade Elizabethtown; Richard V. Showers, F&M; and T. S. Stanford, Penn State.

Robert Harper, Landisville-Salunga Junior Chamber of Commerce, was named the most outstanding member of the JayCee State Executive Committee at the state convention of the national service organization held in Scranton last Saturday night.

Harper served the national organization as the National Director of Zone 5 in Pennsylvania, which is composed of Lancaster, Lebanon, Chester, York and Dauphin counties. He received a traveling trophy in honor of his achievement.

The Hempheld Joint School Authority opened bids last week for construction of the new elementary school at East Petersburg and an addition to the present elementary building at Rohrerstown.

According to the architects, Coleman and Coleman, Landisville, plans for the East Petersburg building call for six classrooms, a faculty room, kindergarten, one multi-purpose room, health rooms, administrative offices, kitchen, cafeteria, and an art and music room.

Low bids on the new structure were, general construction, Herman Wohlshen & Son, \$339,233; plumbing, W. M. Ernst & Son, \$38,350; heating and ventilating, W. M. Ernst & Son, \$61,365; electrical, Harry Gochbauer, \$334,635; kitchen equipment, Here Bros. Inc., \$17,500. Total bids for the structure amounted to \$491,133.

Plans for the addition to the Rohrerstown school indicate an additional six classrooms, a faculty room, and a storage room. Low bids received by the authority were, general construction, Sam Long, \$100,925; plumbing, Roy Ressler, \$10,843; electrical, Zimmerman & Walsh, \$7,900; heating and ventilating, Twin Arc Welding, \$16,412. Total bids amounted to \$136,080.

Future Teachers of America chapter at the Hempheld high school honored the fifty members of the high school faculty and one retired teacher in a special assembly program at the Landisville school sponsored by the future teachers organization.

Miss Ethel Steinkoph who retired last spring after teaching all levels of school in the Hempheld district for 46 years, was presented a red rose by the student group in commemoration of her devotion and contribution to education. The Hempheld high school PTA chapter, organized this year, bears her name. Also presented with red roses in appreciation of their service were the present high school teachers.

During the program, Dr. Daan Nesbit, Millersville State Teachers College faculty member, presented the Hempheld club's charter to Paul Cunningham, faculty adviser, Jay Smith, student president of the organization, introduced Dr. Nesbit to the student assembly. A one-act play on the teaching profession was presented by the PTA chapter.

Total cost for the two East Hempheld elementary structures totaled \$627,213. The five-man authority will arrive at a final decision at a later date following further study of the matter. Authority members are Wm. F. Hoffman, chairman, Christian M. Neff, Clyde S. Weaver, John W. Hoover, Jr., and Earl Albright.
