HENRY S. KOLP Henry S. Kolp, sixty-one 312 College Avenue, Lancaster, bookkeeper and cashier of Bachman Chocolate Man ufacturing Company, Mt. Joy was found dead in bed or the second floor of his home at 10 a.m. Monday, May 13 He lived alone

Dr. Charles P. Stahr, deputy coroner, said death re sulted from a heart attack and estimated Kolp had been dead since 7 a.m. Saturday.

Officials of the Bachman Co. became concerned when Kolp did not report for work Saturday or Monday and city police were notified. A patrolman assigned to the investigation used a ladder to climb through an open second-story window and found Kolp dead in bed.

Kolp was a native of Lancaster county, a son of the late Henry M. and Elizabeth Schickling Kolp. He graduat-ed from Landisville high school in 1913 and the Pennsylvania Business College in 1916. He was employed as a clerk by National Biscuit Co. from 1919 to 1921 and as bookkeeper and cashier at Bachman Chocolate Mfg. Co since 1921. His wife, Hilda R. Shenberger Kolp, died on July 23, 1956.

He served as a corporal in Co. H. 30th Infantry, third Division in World War 1. He was a member of the Lancaster Lodge of, Elks and the American Legion.
