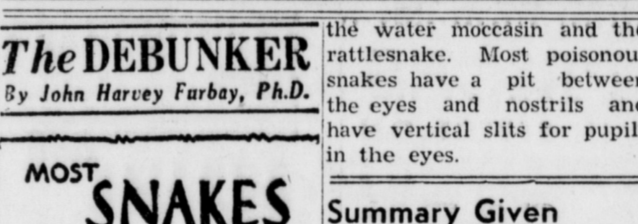
Many Attend Dessert Bridge
