A graduate from Lycoming College in 1954, A. B. summa cum laude, he passed his Garrett comprehensives with distinction.

Rev. Good was ordained and accepted on trial in the Philadelphia Conference, of his church in May, 1956.


Plan D. V. Bible School At Cross Roads
