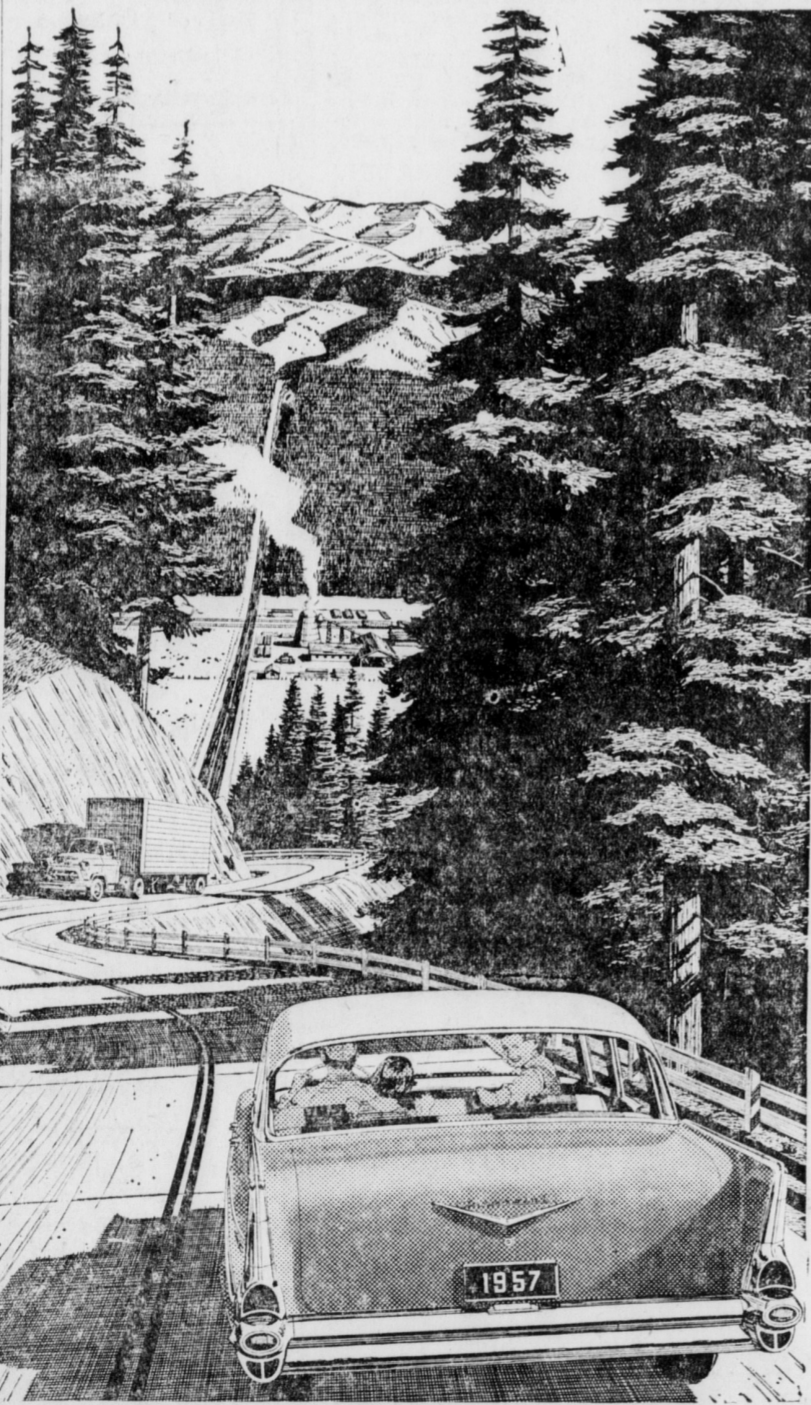

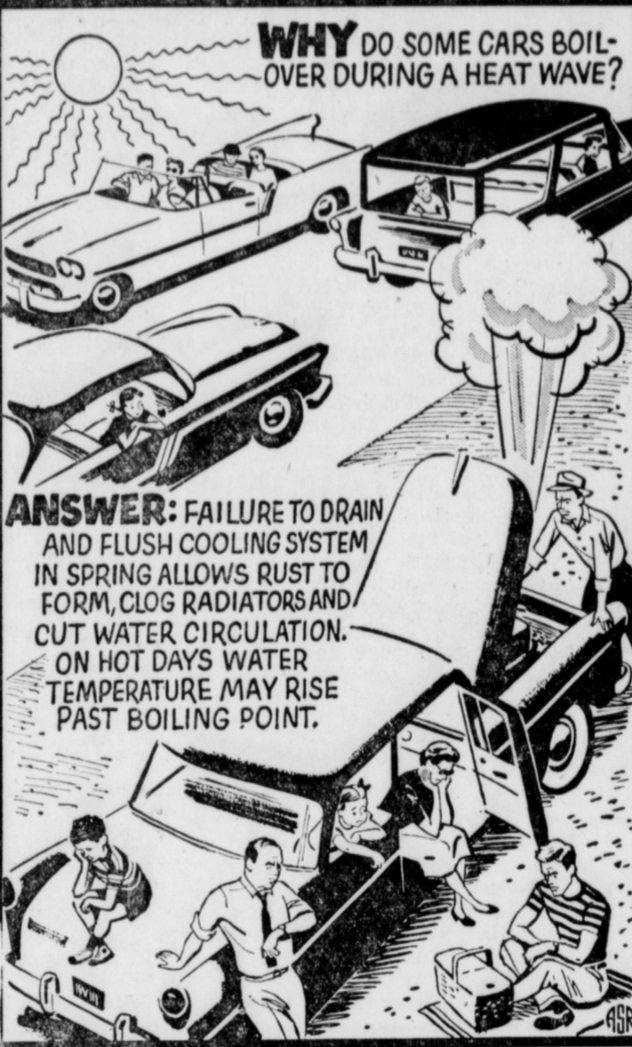

Good Fire Policeman**

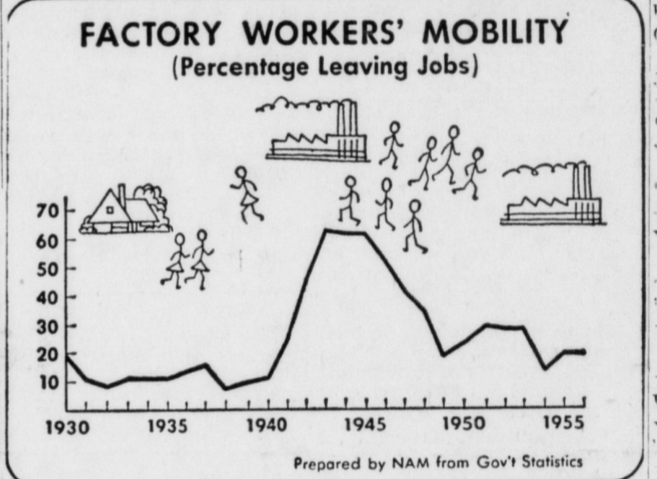

While unemployment figures often are cited for an adverse political effect, a recent study by the National Association of Manufacturers points out that the great number of employees who leave their jobs do so mainly to take advantage of better opportunities in a free expanding economy.

For instance, last year on the average of 1 out of 5 employees in manufacturing—or some 3,300,000 out of nearly 17,000,000—quit their jobs voluntarily. The NAM said some retired, others were women getting married or returning to their homes. But the majority were going to new and better jobs.

A high degree of mobility of workers is a necessary factor in times of rapid industrial expansion and decentralization. But this can be costly to employers during times of employe shortages. Voluntary "quits" invariably are higher when labor markets are tight, as shown by the chart's peak rate of the war years.
