Schedule Given For Week

Next week in addition to the daily morning and afternoon hours, the first special evening event will be an archery demonstration Tuesday evening, June 25, at the borough park playground. The Kinsey Arrow Shop, Florin will present the demonstration as a kick-off for the new archery program which was donated by the Chamber of Commerce. The demonstration is free and will be held from 6 to 8:30 p.m.

Archery will be available at both playgrounds this summer. The program will be closely supervised by the directors.

Thursday evening's special activity will include a treasure hunt beginning from the school playground.

Crafts will be offered on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays this summer. A variety of crafts suitable for all age groups will be offered. Both Mrs. Charles Brooks and Mrs. Marshall Zemberling, directors, are attending craft classes in Lancaster this week.

Opened Monday

The summer season opened Monday and to date approximately 200 children have registered for the two playgrounds. For playground activities, the children are being grouped into three groups at each site; ages 5 to 8, the beginners; 9 to 11, intermediates; and 12 and up, seniors.

Two dances will be held at the elementary school park and two band concerts will be scheduled for the borough park playground. A mother, daughter night is scheduled as well as a father and son night. An all-events night, talent show and archery tournament are also to be offered later in the season.

The last Thursday of the season will be awards night. At this time awards will be presented to the outstanding participants in each of the age groups. Tuesday, August 6, an all-day picnic trip will be held at French Creek.

Two milk machines will be installed at the two parks in order that children may purchase milk during the morning and afternoon sessions.
