### State Police Warn Motorists On Fire Area Violations

Harrisburg State Police recently warned that automobile drivers following or parking within 500 feet of fire apparatus responding to an alarm not only hamper efforts of firemen but also are liable to prosecution.

"Common sense rather than curiosity should prevail in any time of emergency and this is particularly important where fire fighting is concerned," said Col. E. J. Henry, State police commissioner.

"The thrill-seeking fire truck chaser endangers himself and everyone around," he warned. "Those who park near the scene of a fire or where apparatus is stopped in answer to a fire alarm, delay the firemen at a time when minutes can mean the difference between a small fire and one out of control."

The commissioner pointed out to a Pennsylvania News-Service reporter that improper parking along roads leading to the scene of a fire often prevents badly needed additional equipment from reaching the blaze.

He also emphasized the point that the Vehicle Code specifically prohibits such interference and added that state police will continue to prosecute thoughtless drivers who interfere with the movement of fire fighting equipment.

"Too much oftentimes is at stake to do otherwise," he commented.

The Lancaster County Fire Company Salvage Unit; Civil Police Association will hold Air Patrol; Ambulance Associations; Lancaster County Amateur Radio League; Rescue Unit of Civil Defense; Doctors, Nurses, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and Junior Bufts.

All Fire Police of Pennsylvania are invited to attend either as participants or observers.
