Hiring Minors For Summer? Check US, Penna. Laws

Employing minors this summer? A great many firms will be doing so, and to be on the safe side it is well to be familiar with both state and federal laws governing the employment of minors.

About two million youngsters will be employed this summer, according to Labor Secretary Mitchell, with the agricultural industry providing jobs for an estimated 700,000.

Other major sources of jobs for boys and girls are the construction industries, 287,000; resorts, 50,000; amusement and recreation services, 50,000; canning, 30,000; tobacco stemming and redrying, 30,000; gasoline service stations, 24,000; eating and drinking places, 20,000, and railroad, 20,000.

State Laws
Employers not subject to federal child labor regulation must comply with state laws. Where federal law is applicable, the state law is obeyed if it is stricter.

Pennsylvania requires employment certificates for children 14 to 18 years of age and employers are required to maintain proof of age cards. Youths under 18 are limited to an 8-hour day and no more than 44 hours in a 6-day week.

Most jobs held by 14 and 15-year-olds are limited to between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. and a rest period must be provided every five hours. Information on what hazardous jobs minors are not allowed to hold and other details may be obtained at the Association office.

Generally state laws provide for a 14-year minimum for non-factory employment outside school hours. Factory employment usually is allowed for 16-year olds, although in some specific hazardous industries it may be restricted to 18 years.

About 15 states fix the 8-hour day as the maximum working time for minors under 18, while seven others provide for an 8-hour day only for girls under 18. Some states fix maximum weekly
