Rotarians Hear About Banking

Glenn Forney, assistant cashier at the First National Bank and Trust company, gave his fellow Rotarians a "classification" talk Tuesday noon at the weekly luncheon meeting of the club, held at Hostetters.

Using as his subject, "Banking in the U. S. and How it Touches All of Us," he based his remarks chiefly upon the functions of the Federal Reserve System.

The organization virtually controls banking in the U.S., serving many functions of regulation and of service and at the same time exerting heavy economic influence upon the economy of the country.

With diagrams, he showed how the system is organized and how it serves, in one of its capacities, to "clear" checks which are used in intra city business transactions.

He was introduced by Earl Koser, program chairman and vice president. Tuesday was the first meeting of a new Rotary year and the first under the direction of newly-installed President Ray N. Wiley.

At the weekly meeting, Walter Sloan, attendance chairman last year, distributed lapel emblems which indicate the number of years of perfect attendance which each Rotarian has accumulated.

During the past year, Sloan said, the club has had an attendance of 96.31 per cent.
