— SUNDAY —
HAVE REVERENCE FOR LIFE — Attend Church and let this day be a day of rest.

— MONDAY —
HOME SAFETY — Have a place for everything. Your equipment in the sheds, your fences in good repair and your farm well kept.

— TUESDAY —
LIVESTOCK — Take good care of your livestock. Good barns and clean water pay off.

— WEDNESDAY —
FALLS — Planning ahead means fewer accidents and more efficient farming.

— THURSDAY —
HIGHWAY TRAFFIC — Be courteous on the highway. A courteous driver believes in living and letting live. Obey all traffic laws, follow safe driving practice.

— FRIDAY —
MACHINERY — Make sure your equipment is in good operating condition. Keep it well oiled and protected.

— SATURDAY —
REVIEW DAY — Review your week's work. Your farm is your home and livelihood. It is a wonderful thing to own.

— 10 COMMANDMENTS FOR LIVING — As Listed By The National Safety Council

1—Keep Machinery in Good Repair
Make sure your equipment is in safe working condition. Keep all guards and safety devices in position.

2—Operate Tractors Safely
Start tractors smoothly and turn corners slowly. Avoid ditches, bank and soft ground.

3—Know and Obey All Traffic Laws
Be a safe courteous driver and drive a safe car.

4—Speak to Animals When Approaching Them
Animals may "bolt" if startled, so calmly assure them of your presence when approaching.

5—Know and Obey Safety Rules
Don't swim alone, know the depth of the property before diving in. Sit still in small boats.

6—Be Firesighted
Don't smoke around the barn. Don't start fires with kerosene. Be careful with matches.

7—Be a Good Housekeeper
Keep things systematic in your home, in your barn. Keep everything in place.

8—Follow Safety Instructions
Follow printed instructions with all equipment.

9—Apply First-Aid Promptly
Keep first aid kits in your home, in the barn, and on the tractor. Seconds count when an accident happens.

10—Watch For Steps to Prevent Falls
Keep ladders in good repair. Make sure of barn floors. Watch treacherous holes. Watch your step.
