NET EARNINGS G. C. Murphy company net earnings for the first six months of 1957 were \$2,782,440, slightly below the \$3,007,014 reported for 1956, although still above the \$1,712,935 earned in the same period of 1955.

In the first 6 months of 1957 the company opened 5 new stores compared with one in 1956, and installed its Quick-Service equipment and operation in 115 stores.
