Wins Awards For Conservation

Henry H. Hackman, Manheim R2, has been named Pennsylvania's outstanding conservationist.

Hackman, who pioneered the establishment of conservation farming in Lancaster County by changing from "square field" farming to modern contour strip-cropping, was cited August 2 at the Annual meeting of the Keystone Chapter, Soil Conservation Society of America, at Pennsylvania State University.

The citation pointed out that Hackman established perennial hay on some fields and increased the carrying capacity of his pastures through management. These practices have enabled Mr. Hackman to build up a 40-head registered Holstein herd from a modest beginning of five head of cattle.

The award was based on Hackman's work in helping to create the Lancaster County Soil Conservation District his activities as vice chairman of the district, his enthusiasm in conducting conservation tours and presenting illustrated talks, his efforts in organizing watershed associations and his practice of conservation on his own farm

Plant Outlay At New Peak

Expanding at Rate of \$37.9 Billion Yearly

Businessmen expect to increase their outlays on new plant and equipment through the third quarter of this year, according to a survey by the Department of Commerce and the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Returns filed in late April and May by business firms show that capital investment programs are expected to be at seasonally adjusted annual rates of \$37.3 billion and \$37.9 billion, respectively, in the second and third quarters of 1957.

These investment figures represent successive new highs, and compare with actual investment (at annual rates) of almost \$37 billion in the first quarter of this year and just under \$36 billion in the third quarter of 1956.

While the current advance is not so great as that experienced in 1955-56, when investment rose sharply following the 1954 decline, the modest upward trend at such a high level continues to be an element of strength in the business situation.
