Aaron S. Wolgemuth, 54, 117 N. Market St., Mount Joy died unexpectedly at 8:45 p.m. Sunday at the home of a niece, Mrs. Harry R. Goodling, Elizabethtown, where he was visiting for the evening. He had been under the care of a physician for some time.

He was employed as a foreman at Wolgemuth Bros. Inc., feed mill, Florin. He was a member of the Florin Fire Company.

Born in Florin, he was a son of the late David and Katie Shank Wolgemuth and was a member of the Florin Church of the Brethren.

He is survived by his wife, Anna Wolgemuth, and four children: Kenneth Wayne, Chief Warrant Officer, Headquarters Group, U. S. DR. SAMUEL S. SIMONS
Dr. Samuel S. Simons, 67, Mt. Pleasant Rd., Marietta, one of three brothers who formerly practiced in Lancaster, died at 8:10 p.m. on

Friday at his home after a prolonged illness.

Dr. Simons, who combined his interest in the teaching and medical professions, was released from Lancaster General Hospital Thursday. He was hospitalized for almost four weeks.

He specialized in ophthalmology, study of the structure, formation and diseases of the eye.

After graduating in 1908 from Maytown high school, he enrolled at Millersville State Normal, where he was graduated in 1911. He then attended Franklin and Marshall College and was graduated in 1915. He received his M.A. from Columbia University in 1918.

In 1923, he received his M.D. from Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia.

While in the education profession, he taught public schools in Donegal and then became supervising principal of the Upper Leacock and Marietta Borough Schools. He also served as assistant county superintendent of Lancaster County Schools for three years.

He did post graduate work at New York Post Graduate Medical College in 1937, when he first studied ophthalmology, at Harvard in '32 and the University of Pennsylvania in 1938.

Combining the teaching and medical professions, he served as an instructor in the department of ophthalmology in the New York Graduate Medical College for one year and the ophthalmology department at the Jefferson Medical College for four years.

He and his three brothers, Dr. William S. Simons, Marietta, the late Dr. John Simons, and the late Dr. Isaac Simons, practiced in the same building for a number of years in the 600 block of

N. Duke St., Lancaster. He was also a staff member of the department of ophthalmology at Lancaster General Hospital.

Dr. Simons was born in East Donegal Twp., a son of the late John D. and Elizabeth Shirk Simons.

A Presbyterian, he was an elder in the Marietta Church and served as moderator of the Donegal Presbytery.

Professional social memberships included the American Assn. for the Study of Neoplastic Disease, the American College of Physicians, and the American Medical Assn.

He was also a member of the Masonic Lodge and the Harrisburg Consistory of the Zemo Shrine.

Married twice, his first wife Reba Goodman Simons, died in 1942. His second wife, the former Elizabeth Meminger, survives.

Surviving, in addition to his wife and brother, are a son, Major David Goodman Simons, M.D., Alamogordo, Air Force Base, New Mexico; a daughter, Elizabeth Ann, wife of John Alden Mason, Swarthmore, and six grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Tuesday from the residence and the English Presbyterian Church at Marietta.


