Landisville - Salunga

A committee of board Joint School Board will present information to the citizens of East and West Hempfield townships and Mountville boro during the next 2 months concerning the advantages of changing the present jointure to a union school district.

The three-man committee is scheduled to present a panel discussion on the matter to the Mountville Lions Club on Sept. 24, the East Petersburg Rotary Club on Sept. 26, and East Petersburg Parent-Teachers Association on Sept. 16. Also scheduled for September are the Farmdale Parents Association, the Mountville Parents Association and the Röhren P.T.A. During the month of October, the group will address the Landisville Lions Club, the East Hempfield Exchange Club and the Landisville P.T.A.

The public relations committee presenting the program is headed by J. Richard Nissley, chairman, Harry Reissler and Christ Greider, Arthur A. Hackman, supervising principal, is assisting them.

Each of the individual boards in the three areas comprising the jointure has voted its approval of the change to the union-type organization. The final decision will be left in the hands of the voters of the district when the question is placed on the ballot in the general elections this November.

James W. McElfatriek, of Phoenixville, District Governor of 14-D, Lions International, addressed the members of the West Hempfield Lions Club last Thursday at a meeting of the civic organization at the Silver Spring Fire Hall.

The district governor, in making his first official visit to the West Hempfield Lions, spoke to the group on the goals of Lions International for the year. The speaker was introduced by Joseph


