Two Holstein milk cows owned by farmers in this area have made outstanding official production records, according to results released by the Holstein-Friesian association of America.

Working in close cooperation with the national organization a and Pennsylvania State University, records on weight and testing are kept as part of the herd improvement program.

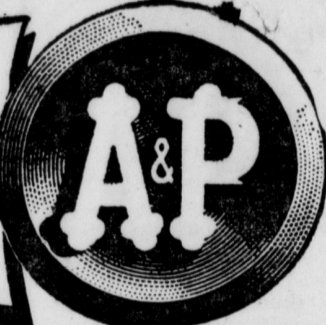

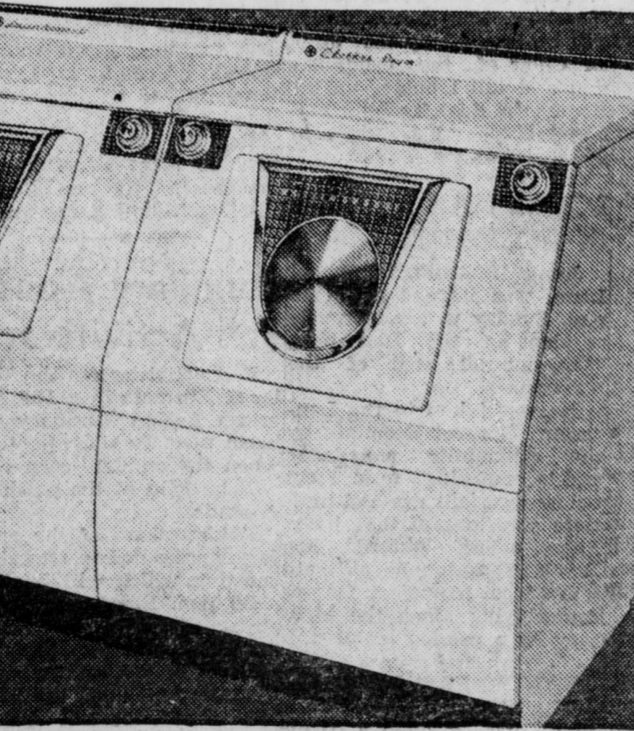
