Philip M. Talbott, president of The Chamber of Commerce of the United States, says:

"When I was asked to write something for the very worthwhile occasion of NATIONAL BUSINESS WOMEN'S WEEK, it suddenly occurred to me that the success of women in business and industry is no longer news.

"Simply to say that 'Miss or Mrs. Smith or Jones' has been promoted to an important position, while trying to make the point that this is remarkable because of the incumbent's sex, is almost absurd in these times.

"Not long ago, the New York Stock Exchange reported that more than one-half of all stockholders are women—and the larger percentage held preferred stock. It may be, that in the long run we men will find we have been working for the ladies all along. I'm confident that this will not really come as news either. In brief, we have reached the point where it is possible and entirely natural for both men and women to accept women as executives, and as successful participants in our whole national economy.
