Study Donegal Enrollment

A study in the increased enrollment of the Donegal high school and the elementary schools in the four districts prove that something must be done to cope with the present school system. At the present time in a high school that was built for 800 students as a maximum, the total is already past the 800 mark.

The following figures estimate how the enrollment will be increasing in the next six years. In 1958, 81 students will be graduating and 191 entering high school. 1959 will graduate and 232 will enter; 1960, 157 will graduate and 230 will enter; 1961, 164 will graduate and 217 will enter; 1962, 158 will graduate and 194 will enter; and in 1963, 178 will enter. During the business meeting, new officers will be chosen for the coming three-year term. Wilbur Hiestand, president, will be in charge.

One step in solving the problem would be the formation of a union district. Under the system of the union school district, more state tax dollars would be returned to the local district. The bonus per teaching unit is \$800 under a union district but the bonus now received for the jointure is \$500 per teaching unit.

Based on the 1957-58 figures, this amounts to about \$19,300.00 per year. In other words, each year that the formation of a union district is postponed, almost \$20,000.00 in state financial aid is lost.

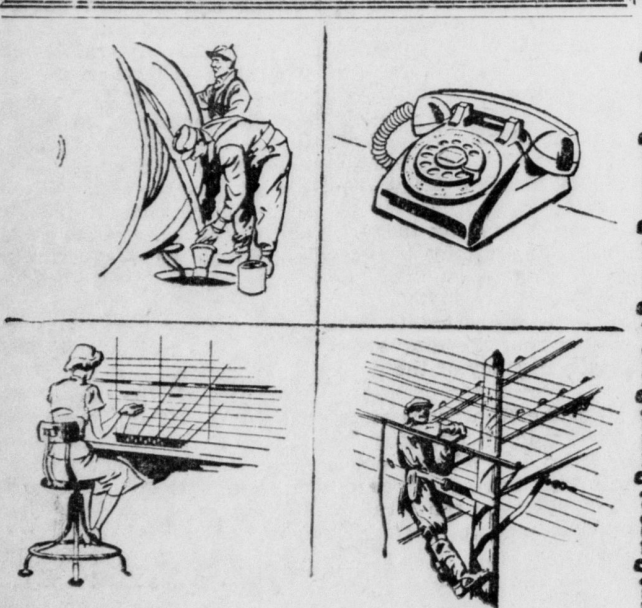
