P.P. & L. Shows Stock Earnings

Earnings accruing to the common stock of Pennsylvania Power & Light Company for the 12 months ended August 31, were \$19,599,471, equivalent to \$3.31 per share of common stock outstanding at such date, as compared with \$19,533,459 or \$3.30 per share for the 12 months ended Aug. 31, 1956. Both were after giving effect to recent orders of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission requiring certain refunds and rate reductions, including non-recurring interest applicable to such refunds.

Earnings for last year include earnings of former subsidiary. The Scranton Electric Company, which was merged January 31, 1956. Revenues for the 12 months ended August 31, 1957, after appropriate adjustment to reflect such Commission orders, were \$129,763,065, an increase of 2.2% over comparable revenues for the previous year.
