The Landisville Fire Company will hold a Baby Beef Supper on Saturday, Oct. 12 to culminate a three year drive of fund-raising campaigns for a new fire engine. According to Robert Lawrence, fire company president, the new fire-fighting piece is expected to arrive in Landisville by October 12 and will be put on display during the supper. The fire truck, a 1957 model built by the Mack Truck Company, will replace the present ten-year old engine. The family-style meal will be served at the Landisville Fire Hall between 12 and 2 p.m., and between 4 and 8 p.m.

The three-year fund-raising project by the fire company included such activities as block shows, suppers, a white elephant sale, a festival, and tobacco-raising. The tobacco-growing project, done this year, netted the company about 3,000 lbs. Two sections of ground were donated rent-free by two anonymous persons, and the third tobacco plot belonged to the Fire Co. Members of the company assisted in the planting, cultivating and harvesting.

The first edition of the Hempfield football team will meet its first gridiron opponents in a regular game Monday, October 7, on the Landisville field. Competing this year on a junior varsity basis, the Black Knights, coached by Clarence Mentzer, will take on Solana high school's jayvee team with the opening kick-off slated for 4 p.m.

In pre-season tests, the Hempfield pigskin carriers scrimmaged with jayvee teams from Columbia high school, Patton School, and McCaskey of Lancaster. According to head coach Mentzer, his boys were impressive in spite of the fact that all of them never played the game before and they were up against boys who had two and three years experience behind them in scrimmage.

Other games on schedule are with Exeter Township from the Reading area October 14, and with Cocalico on

October 21. Both these games will be played on the opponents field. Hempfield will become a member of the Conference of Roses football league in 1958 and will participate in regular varsity competition beginning that season. Mentzer is assisted by Richard McDonough and Christ Hondras.

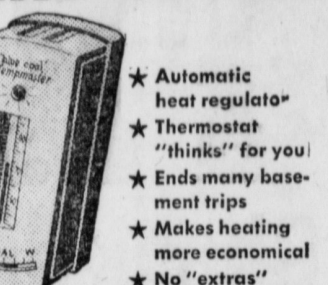
