AG Department Chosen For Test

In cooperation with the Pennsylvania State University, the Donegal high school agricultural department was chosen as one of thirty in the state to conduct a Safe Tractor Maintenance Operation Experiment.

The boys in the eleventh and twelfth grades first took a test to check their knowledge on tractor maintenance. They are now conducting 14 jobs on the care and maintenance. After the completion of the jobs, they will be re-tested. Donegal's agricultural department was chosen as one of thirty schools from the 382 schools with ag departments in the state.

This experiment may lay the groundwork for a possible Young Farmer's Class in the Donegal area.

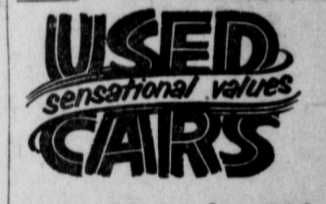

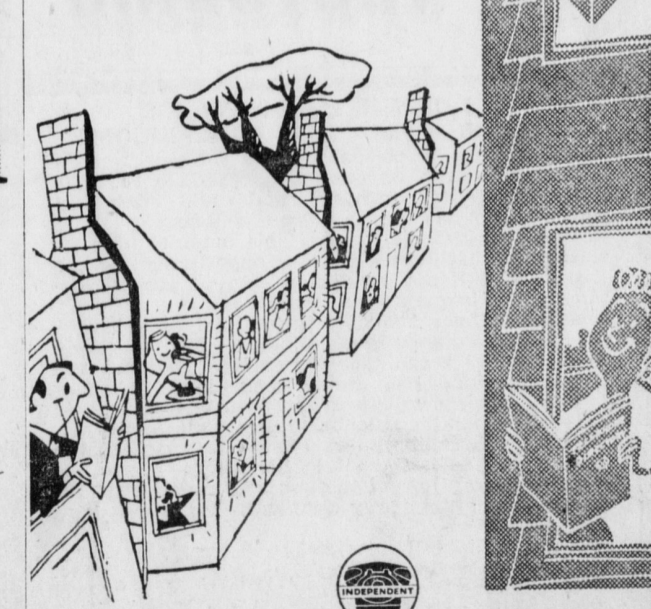
