By districts, it was East Hempfield Twp. with 970 for and 276 against; East Petersburg, 157 for and 37 against; West Hempfield Twp., 701 for and 197 against; and Mountville, 228 for and 29 against.

In a union organization, the district stands to gain an estimated \$20,000 dollars through State reimbursements for the school year under the present student enrollment, with an increase in reimbursement proportion to any increase in the student population. Under the new system, children will be able to attend the school nearest their home regardless of the district in which they reside. Transportation problems will be less, and with greater ease and facility in transporting children to school. Expenses for transportation will also be lowered.

All present school directors will continue in office until present term expires. The total number of school directors will be gradually be seven. However, no district will be without representation.
