## Rotarians Hear Fantastic Story About 'Saucers'

One of the most fascinating and yet fantastic programs ever given Rotarians was presented Tuesday noon by Prof. George McGinnis of Franklin and Marshall college as he discussed "Flying Saucers."

A hobbyist in the field, McGinnis has been a keen observer since flying saucers were first sighted in 1948 and he has built up a tremendous pool of information and incidents of "U. F. O."

U. F. O. is the name assigned to the subject - unidentified Flying Objects.

After carefully establishing the reliability of his sources and of the existence of unexplained flying objects he cited many weird and mysterious cases in which "saucers" have played a part.

There are hundreds of "observations" which have been made and at times as many as 750 per month are reported and the speaker introduced Wright-Patterson field by vice-president Earl Koser.

in Ohio, where the information is sifted McGinnis said. McGinnis, although he has not seen a flying saucer himself, has talked with those who say they have and his theories of the happenings refer to explanation except by belief that there is some kind of flying objects that have power and maneuverability far in excess of that known by anyone on this planet.

The speaker was of the opinion that "flying saucers" are not instruments of the United States government or of any other. It is his firm belief that they are from planets not even in our solar system.

He told of the disappearances of planes and men and of the experiences of pilots, radar men, passengers and even hundreds of ground observers who claim to have had personal knowledge of the existence of saucers.

Speeds ranging from none to 5,000 miles per hour are reported and examples of tremendous forces of self preservation have been observed.
