Jon Fackler Wins Annual Democracy Voice Award

Jon Fackler, 15, a member of the junior class of Hempfield high school, was named winner of the annual Voice of Democracy contest held last week at the Landisville school. The contest is sponsored annually in the Hempfield area by the Landisville-Salunga Junior Chamber of Commerce. Fackler's speech has been tape recorded and will be entered in the statewide eliminations at Harrisburg this month. The state contest is also sponsored by the JayCees.

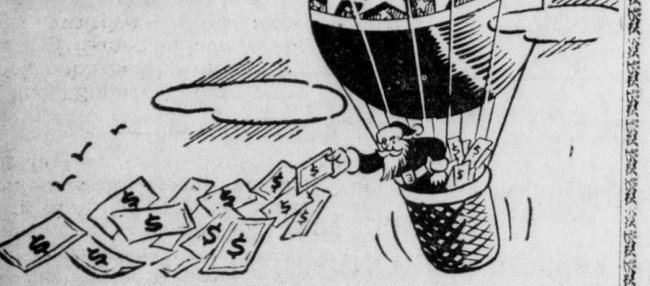
