Jaycees Plan Six More Public Refuse Cans

Mount Joy Jaycees decided during Jaycee Week at the Lincoln Restaurant and the Mount Joy Diner. The place at a cost of \$300 and to donate \$620 to the War Memorial banquet to be held by the Park at the Wednesday night meeting of the group.

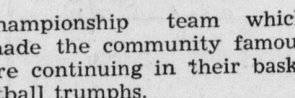
