**Learn To Control Your Car
When It Goes Into a Skid**

Motorists can stop skidding on slippery roads and streets by observing two well-established rules, advises Edward P. Curran, Safety Director of Keystone Automobile Club. First rule: Release the brakes on the car immediately. Second: Steer in direction of skid. "Too quick, or heavy-footed braking causes most skidding," Curran continued. "So by removing the pressure on the brakes the cause is eliminated. But the effect may continue and the best thing to do is to steer in the direction of the skid. "Steering into the skid means simply that if the wheels slide to the right . . . as often they do . . . the car should be steered in that direction. Again, if the rear wheels slip to the left . . . as they may do if the brakes are not properly equalized . . . the steering wheel should be turned in that direction. "Many drivers become panicky when their cars start to skid and jam on the brakes in a desperate effort to stop the machine, forgetting that they must first stop the skid. The impulse to apply the brakes harder when a car slides off on a tangent must be resisted, because a smash-up virtually is inevitable unless the skid is gotten under control. "And, finally, icy roads are not the only skidding hazards. Wet pavements, unequal tire pressures, inequality of brake changes in the direction of travel and rough road surfaces all contribute to the danger."
