Hempfield Hi-To Give Yule Program Dec. 18, 19

"Christmas Everywhere" seniors in this year's squad will be a featured part of the annual Christmas program sponsored by the students of the Hempfield high school music department next Wednesday and Thursday, Dec. 18 and 19, at the Landisville school auditorium, beginning at 8:00 p.m. The program was written by a senior girl, Miss Jean Kauffman, and will feature the music of other countries. It will be narrated by Jon Fackler, a junior.

The program will open with an organ prelude by Joyce Sacco, Mary Fahringer and Muriel Rinley, followed by the Boys Chorus singing "Nativity Miniatures", and "O Come, O Come Emmanuel". Following a candle-light procession, the senior chorus will sing, "Gloria! Gloria!" "Behold a Star From Jacob Shining", "Christ Child", "Christmas Day", and "Christmas Caravan". This series of vocals will include soloists Esther Brubaker, Lois Ann Haag, Robert Ridder and B. Oberholzer. The orchestra will play, "I Came Upon Midnight Clear", "O, Little Town of Bethlehem", and "Away in a Manger".

The seventh grade chorus will be heard in the selections "Bring A Torch, Janette, Isabelle", "Behold That Star", "White Christmas". The junior high school chorus will sing, "The Christ is Born Today", "Jesu, Joy of Mans Desiring", "Winds Through the Olive Trees", and "Susan Belle", a mountain carol. The organ, which will feature the organ selections, "Greensleeves" and "Cradle Song", played by Norma Book and Betty Jean Hostetter.

The featured part of the program, the pageant "Christmas Everywhere", will open with the orchestra playing "Trenak", and "Steigh Ride".
