Landisville - Salunga Fire Threatens Home

Smouldering embers from a fireplace in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Mentzer, Church St., Landisville, ignited some pasteboard cartons and threatened the home with fire last Friday afternoon. Mr. Mentzer reported that the fireplace was in use Thursday night, and that his wife cleaned the fireplace around noon on Friday, putting the charred wood in a carton and placing it in an adjoining garage for disposal. Apparently, there were still some embers hot enough to ignite the carton.

Clarence Mentzer, physical education teacher at Hempfield high school, was home for lunch and detected the smell of smoke, and after tracing it to the garage, arrived in time to extinguish the blaze before any serious damage occurred.

The Landisville Fire Company was summoned, but their services were not needed. The blaze threatened explosion of an oil tank located in the garage, and charred some window screens stored overhead.
