Dr. Edward G. Kottcamp, Marietta, deputy coroner, said death resulted from asthma and acute coronary failure.

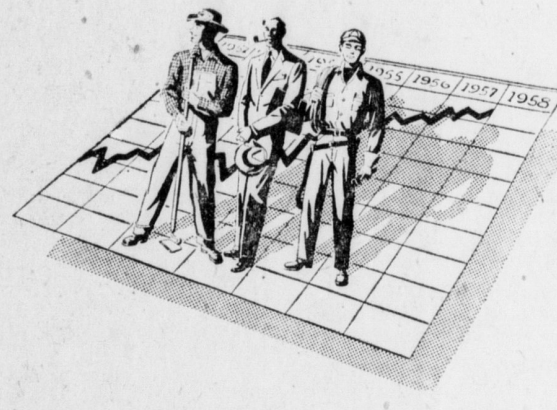
He was born in Conoy Twp. a son of the late Daniel and Mary Shellenberger Dupler and was a building contractor.
