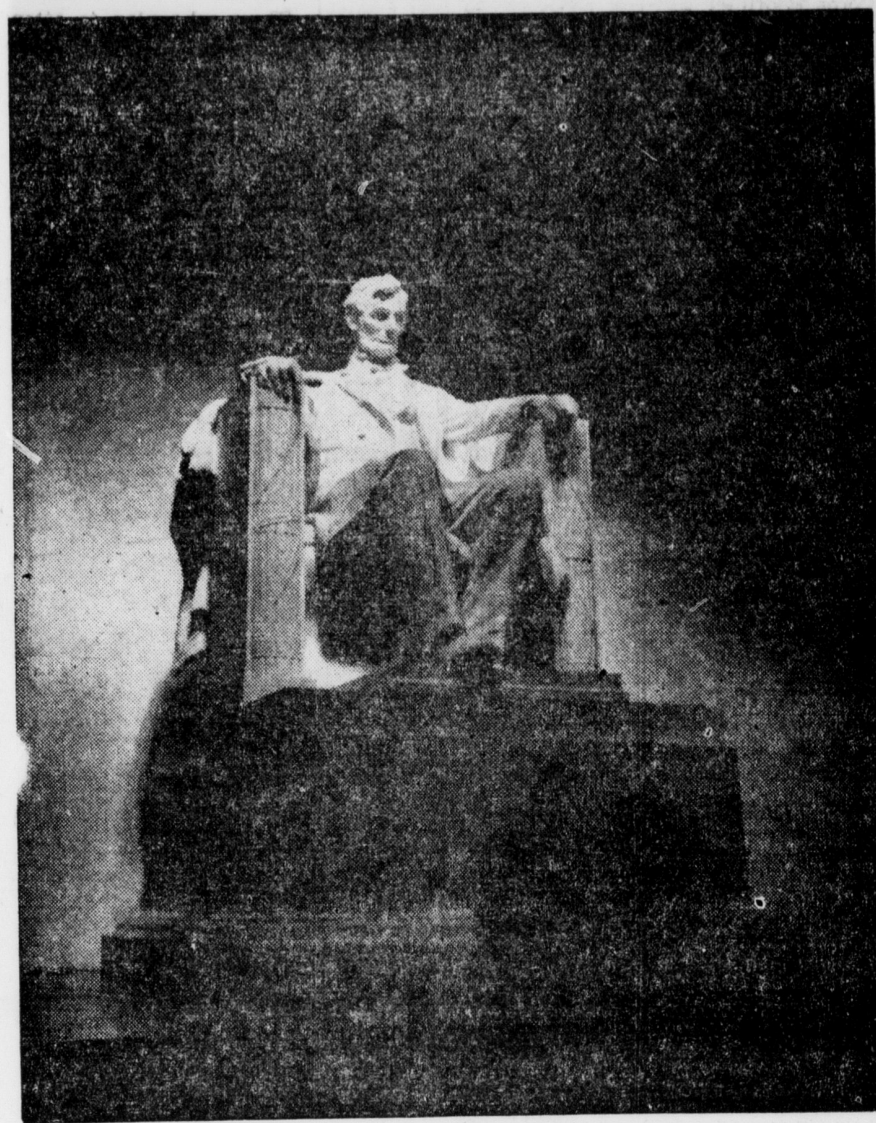

Union Lenten Service Series Is Planned

Union Lenten Evangelistic Services are being planned by a Committee of the Mount Joy Ministerial Association for the first six Wednesday evenings of the pre-Easter period. Services will be held in each of five participating churches with speakers being selected from the several denominations represented.

The first of the series of services will be held Feb. 14 in St. Mark's Evangelical United Brethren Church with the Rev. Kenneth R. Maurer, Dean of the School of Theology at Myerstown, serving as the evangelist. The second service will be held in the Trinity Evang. Congregational Church a week later, Feb. 26, with the Rev. Charles Wonderley, pastor of the Centenary Methodist Church of Lebanon preaching. March 5, the Rev. Harry W. Weber, pastor of the Leacock Presbyterian Church of Paradise, will preach in the Methodist Church. On March 12, the Rev. Thomas Tillett, Landisville Church of God, and a brother to the pastor of the Mount Joy Church of God, will be the evangelist in the service held in the Presbyterian Church. The service Mar. 19 will be conducted in the Church of God with the Rev. W. Maynard Sparks, chaplain of Lebanon Valley College preaching. The concluding service of the series will be held in St. Mark's E. U. B. Church with the Rev. Nevin H. Zuck, pastor of the Elizabethtown Church of the Brethren, bringing the message.

Special music will be provided by the choirs of the participating churches. Believing prayer to be vital to the success of these meetings, the Committee is urging Christians to unite in informal prayer periods preceding each service from 7 to 7:30 p. m. in a place to be designated within the Church and to otherwise join in prayer for these meetings.

Serving as chairman of this Committee is the Rev. C. E. Ulrich, St. Mark's E. U. B.; the Rev. D. R. Wolfe is Secretary, and the Rev. Menno E. Good is Treasurer. Other committee members are the Rev. Wm. Tillett and Mr. Maurice Bailey, representing the Presbyterian congregation at present without a pastor.

Individual Lenten Services will be conducted by the congregations of the Trinity Lutheran and St. Luke's Episcopal Churches.
