## Landisville - Salunga

Lancaster County's biggest snow storm in thirty years is still the biggest topic of conversation in the Landisville-Salunga area. The blizzard and accompanying freezing temperatures almost brought to a standstill the daily routine of practically all the residents and business establishments of the area. The storm, which started quietly enough that Saturday afternoon, caught many persons away from their homes at the height of its fury. This reporter had his car stalled in heavy drifts two miles west of Lancaster on the Old Harburg Pike, but was fortunate enough to hail a ride for him and his wife to within a mile of his home, and then had to trek the remaining distance through waist-high drifts and icy winds, arriving home well after midnight. Many other persons had to leave their cars and struggle home on foot or else find shelter and lodging at nearby homes. Many homes in the vicinity went without milk and bread deliveries for five days. One farmer near Landisville delivered bread to one area of homes with a tractor, while another supplied raw milk to homes where there were infants and young children. Others baked bread at home and shared it with neighbors. Some did without these staples. But it is an ill wind that doesn't blow some good. The almost complete isolation in some areas brought about by the heavy snows created the sharing of food supplies between neighbors, thus establishing a close friendship where there was only a casual acquaintance before. Several homes, low on fuel, were replenished from ample supplies of other homes. Snow removal crews of East Hempfield Twp. labored long and hard in the herculean task of clearing tons of snow from the many roads. Many bleys shut again due to heavy drifting snow, and routes over fields were a common thing in spots where the drifts were too great to penetrate.

Hempfield Joint School District closed its five elementary schools and the high school at Landisville for the entire week before re-opening last Monday. The church services were suspended, and many other local service and social organizations cancelled or postponed their functions. But for the most part, the people of the community took the history-making blizzard in their stride and reacted to it admirably, doing what they could with what they had, and without showing undue signs of alarm or panic.
