## PP&L Opens New Offices At Columbia

Pennsylvania Power and Light Company will open its newly-completed Columbia District service center at Fifth and Poplar Streets, in Columbia or Monday, March 3, at 8:00 a.m., for customer service, it was announced today by T. R. Frye, P. P. & L's District Manager at Columbia.

The district service center concept centralizes the electric company's operations for increased efficiency and greater convenience of all customers, where customers can, in air-conditioned comfort, transact any business with the company from paying bills to requesting service. In addition there is a meeting room with seating space for 50 persons, where cooking and appliance demonstrations and shows will be given for customers, electric appliance dealer meetings will be held and local organizations invited to use the room for their bake sales and other civic and charitable activities of broad interest to the community.

The new center consolidates all of the local utility's customer service functions which, previously, were at scattered locations in the Columbia area. With this consolidation, P. P. & L. will be able more efficiently to serve the increasing needs of more than 17,000 customers located in West Hempfield, East and West Donegal and Mount Joy Townships and western parts of Manor, East Hempfield and Rapho Townships and the eastern section of Lower Windsor Township. The area includes the Boroughs of Columbia, Elizabethtown, Mount Joy, Mountville, Marietta, Washington Boro and Wrightsville.

Also, at the one-story, buff-colored brick center, will be quarters for line and service crews and meter readers. There will be storage space for company vehicles.
