Totalling an estimated \$19.5 billion, U. S. exports reached a record peak in 1957 and topped the 1956 figure by 13 percent, according to the Commerce Department. Imports, at about \$13 billion, showed a 2 percent gain.

### Fringe Inflation

According to the U.S. Department of Commerce, between 1929 and 1956 the cost of such legally required "fringe" benefits as old-age and survivor's insurance, unemployment and workman's compensation, and the cost of private welfare benefits such as life and health insurance and pensions, rocketed from \$500 million a year to a staggering \$11.7 billion, and from one to six percent of total wages and salaries.
