Chiques Church

Tops Fund Goal

G. Walter Sloan, chairman of the financial committee of Chiques Methodist Church, reports that a total of \$50,092.50 has been pledged to the building fund by the congregation.

The goal of the drive was \$40,000—to be given over a 150-week period. The canvass was directed by the Wells Organization, Church fund raisers.

Chiques church was formed by the Union of the Mt. Joy and Salunga Methodist churches in November of last year. An eight acre tract of land half way between the two present buildings on Route 230 has been purchased as a site for a new church and educational building, and a parsonage. No date has been set for the completion of this building project. Rev. Menno E. Good is minister of the church.

Concert Planned For Saturday

A Sacred Concert will be given by the Elizabethtown College choir (accompanied and a cappella) Saturday night, April 12, in the local Church of God.
