Holsteins Set High Records

Two local dairymen have been notified of recent high production marks set by their cows in official tests conducted by the Holstein-Friesian association of America.

A. W. Wickenheiser had two cows complete 365-day tests. One produced 17,607 pounds of butterfat as a 9-year-old and the other produced 17,514 pounds milk and 701 pounds butterfat. Both were milked twice a day.

In a herd, lactation test, recently completed, 24 cows owned by Henry M. Hess, averaged 12,060 pounds milk and 456 pounds of butterfat. The tests, known as Herd Improvement Registry, were taken twice daily over a period of 305 days.
