# Strikes Drop To New Low

The number of strikes and total man-days of idleness were lower in the first six months of 1958 than in the first half of any postwar year, according to preliminary estimates of the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

However, the number of workers involved was slightly higher than the 1957 level. An estimated 1,525 strikes began in this period, idled about 720,000 and resulted in over 7 million man-days of idleness.

# The Bulletin, Mount Joy, Pa. Thursday, September 25 5

The 350 stoppages beginning in June reflected no change from May, but a slight decrease as compared with June 1957. The number of employees involved in strikes beginning during the month increased from 150,000 in May to 160,000 in June 1958. This latter estimate is slightly higher than for June 1957.

Total idleness of 1,650,000 man-days in June represents a decrease of approximately 20 percent from the May total.
